SN	Requirements	Status	Notes
1	Valid Passport	Required	Must be valid for at least 6 months beyond your arrival date.
2	Photo	Required	Clear solo photo with white background (JPEG format)
3	Flight Ticket Reservation	Optional	I booked a confirmed round-trip ticket.
4	Hotel Reservation	Optional	I used Booking.com with no prepayment required.

## Application Steps

1. Visit: <https://indianvisaonline.gov.in/evisa/tvoa.html>
2. Fill out the form – Provide your personal details and travel info.
3. Prepare files for upload: (A) Photo: Clear solo photo with white background (JPEG format) and (B) Passport: Main page scan (PDF format)
4. Submit your application – No payment required!
5. Wait for approval – Mine was approved in 2 days.

**Indians are among the most welcoming people I have ever met. They smile a lot and never hesitate to agree to take a picture with you.**

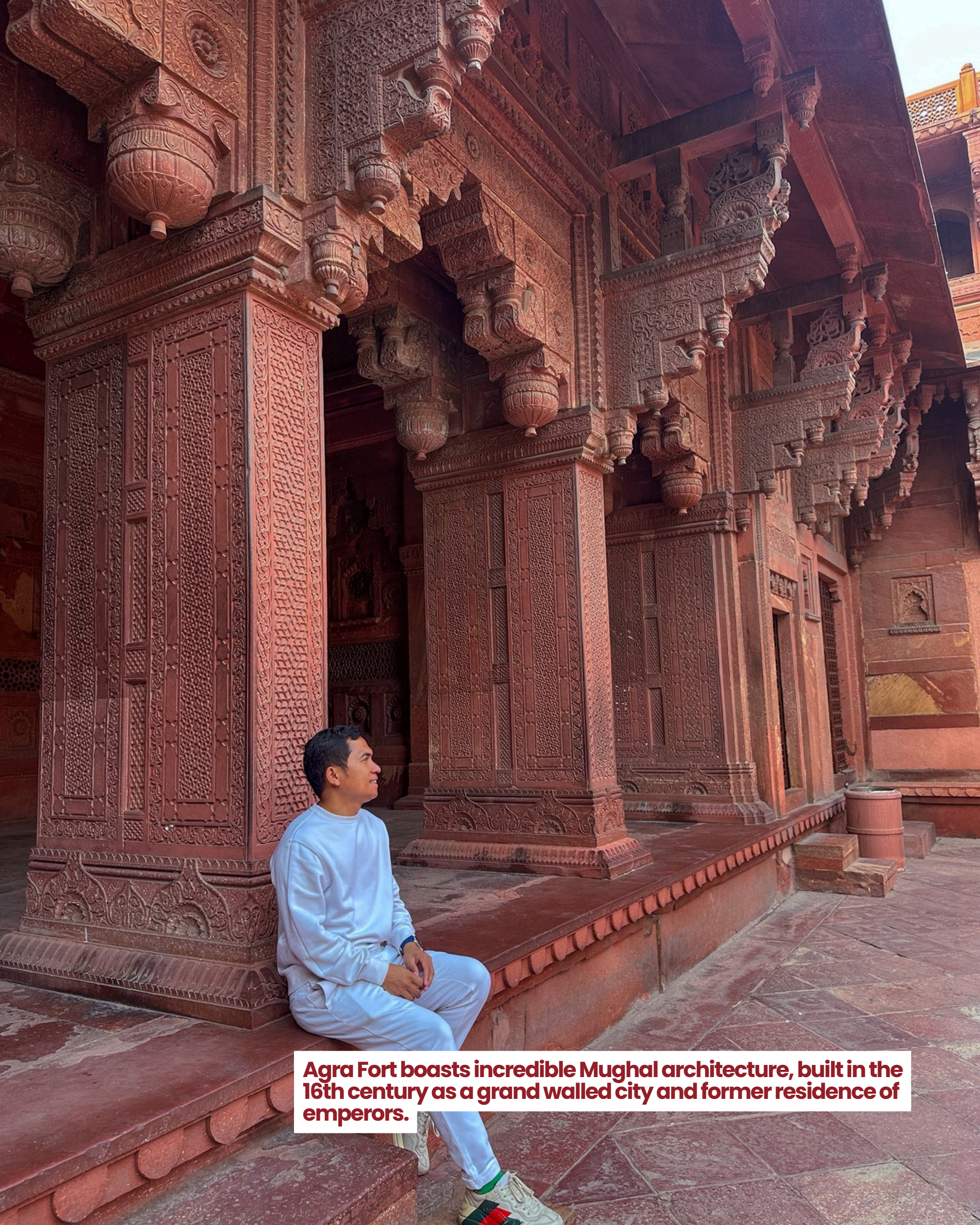




**Jal Mahal appears to float on the waters of Man Sagar Lake, a stunning architectural marvel with a rich history dating back to the 18th century.**







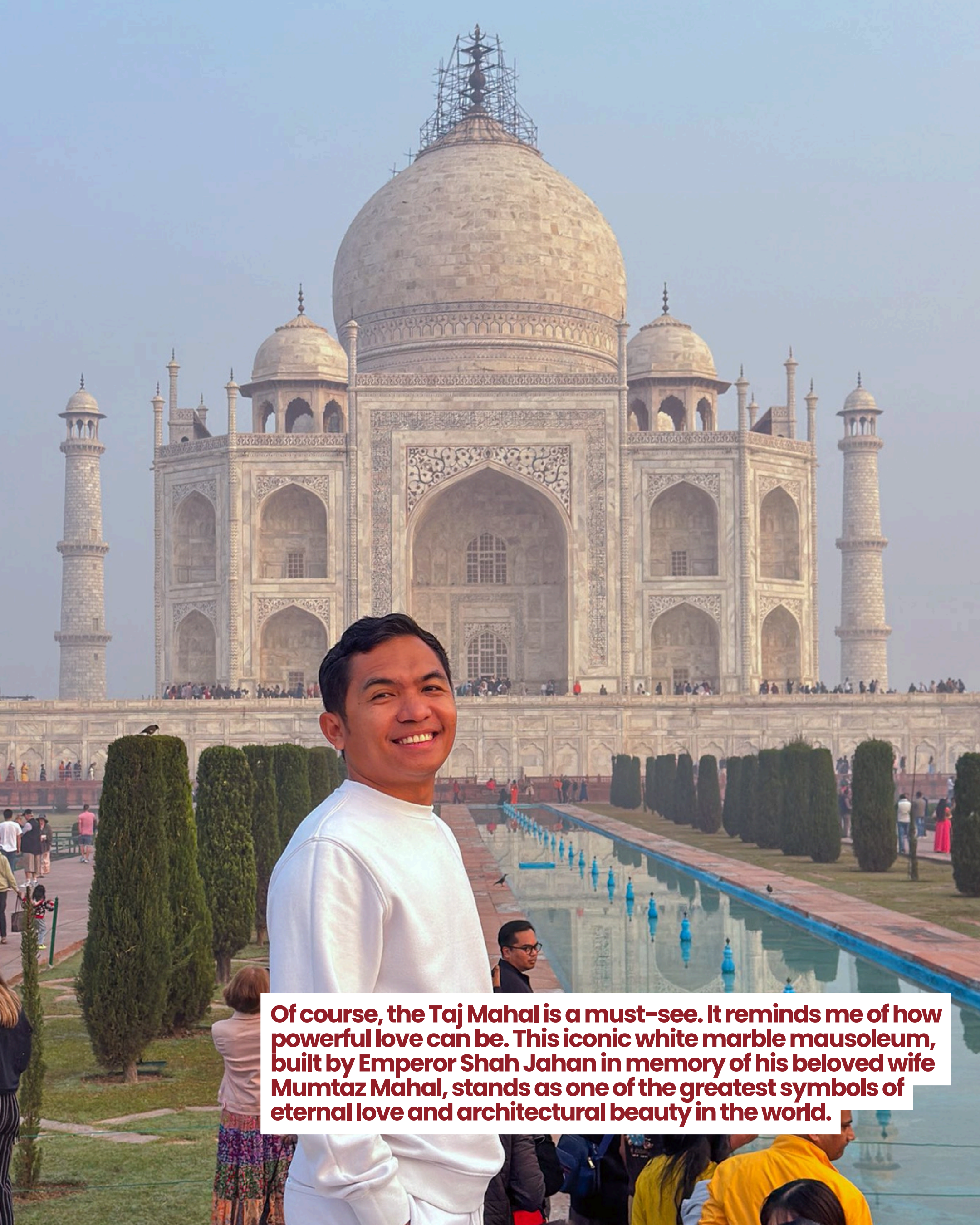
**Agra Fort boasts incredible Mughal architecture, built in the 16th century as a grand walled city and former residence of emperors.**

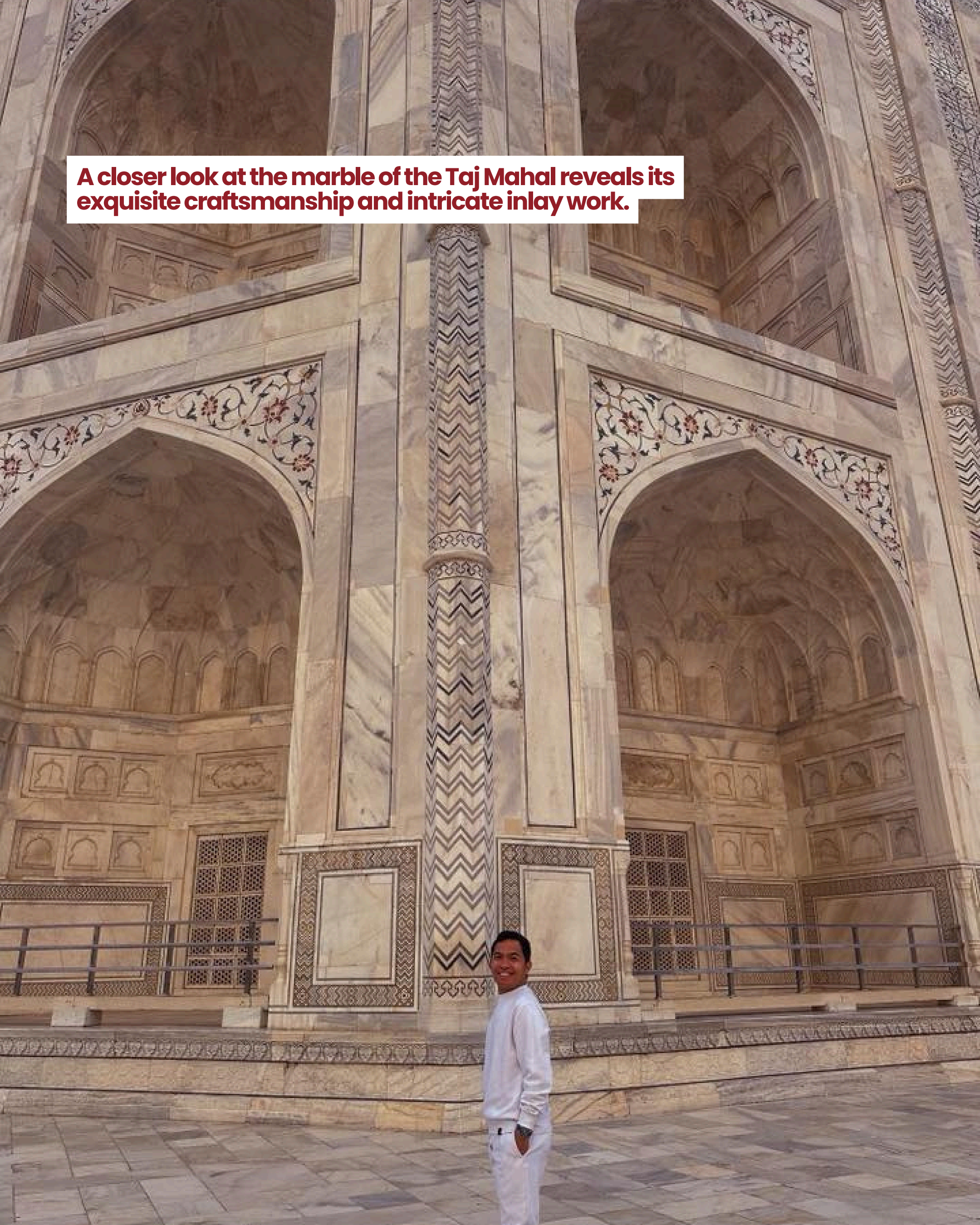


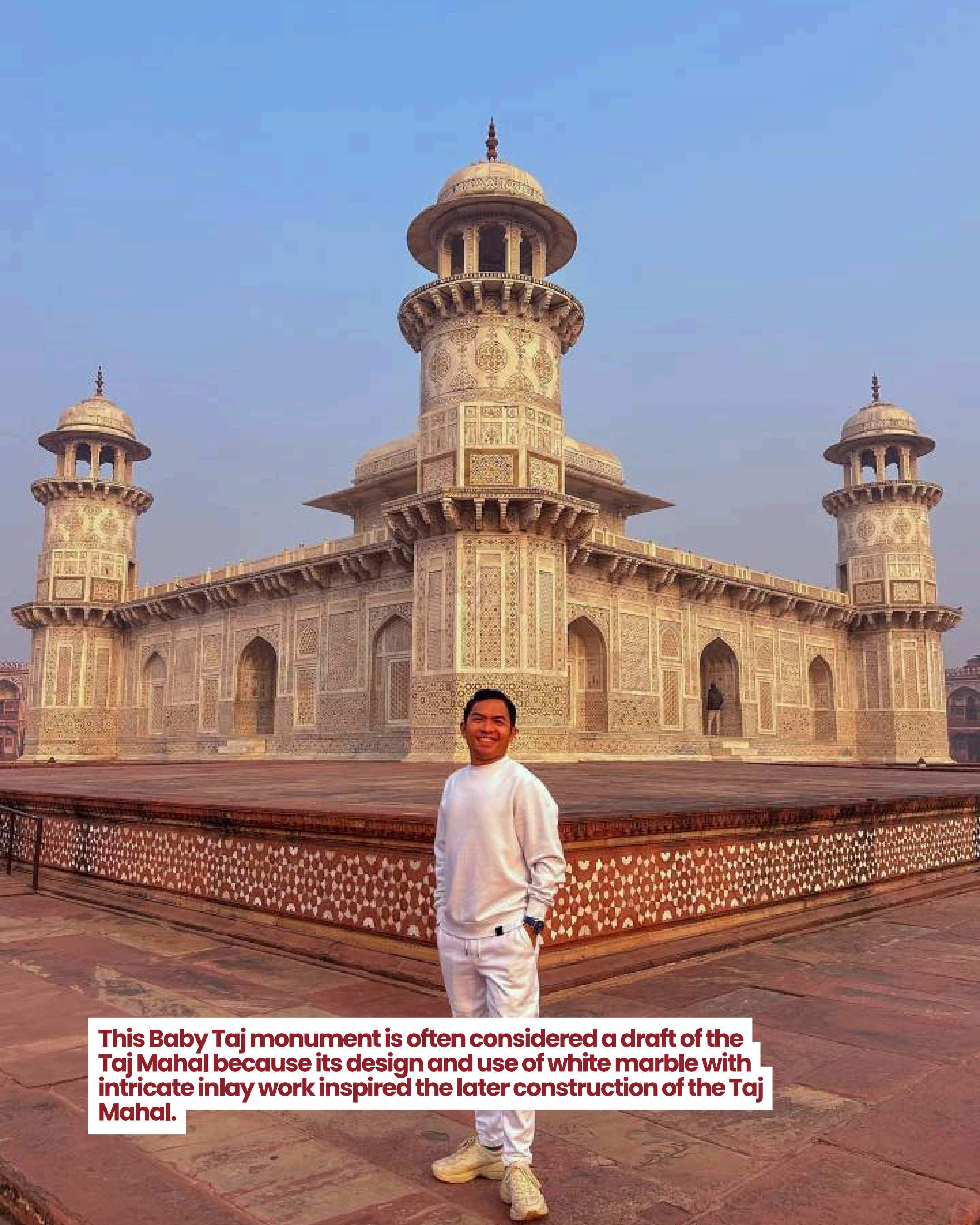

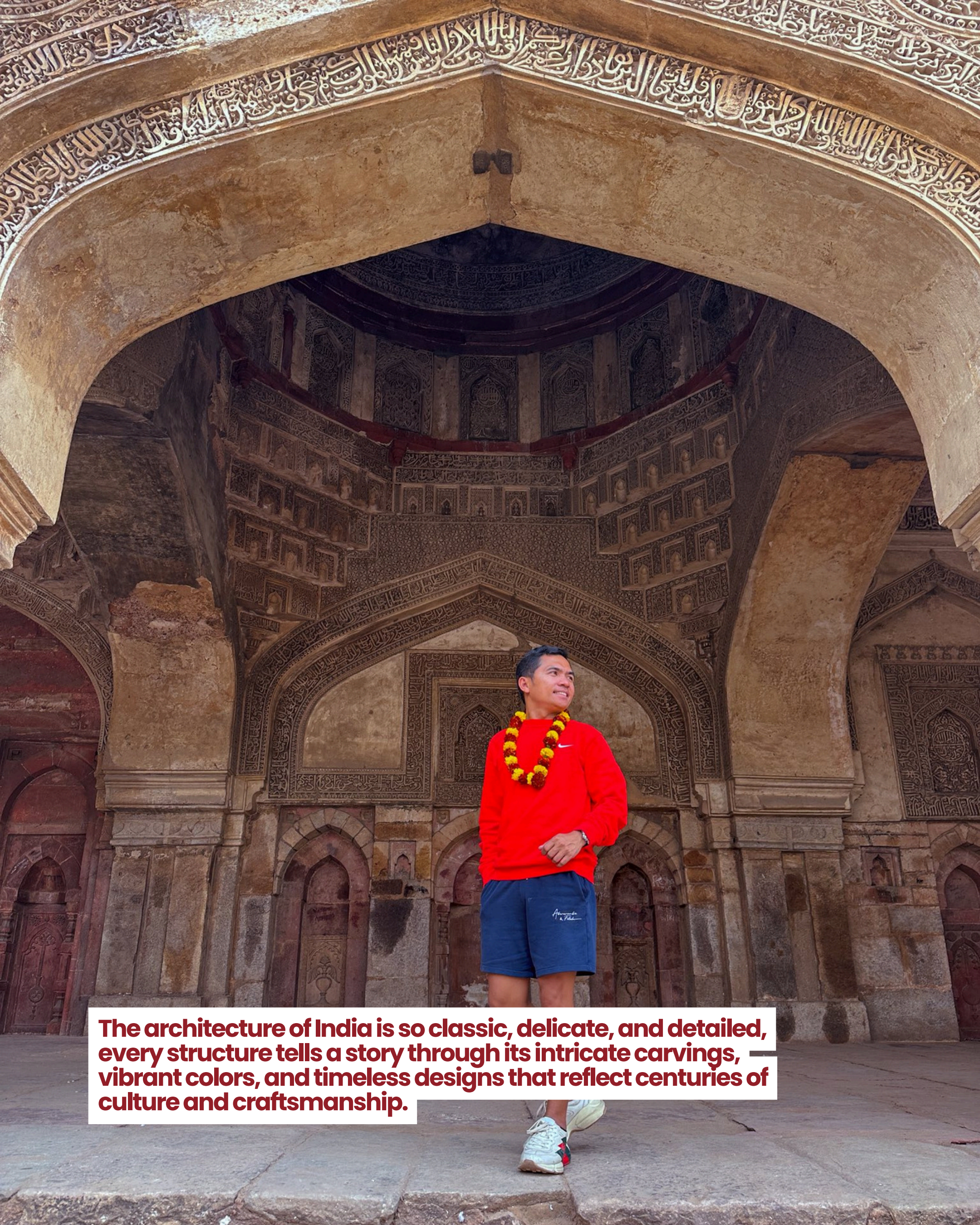
**A closer look at the marble of the Taj Mahal reveals its exquisite craftsmanship and intricate inlay work.**

- **E-Arrival Form:** Complete it 72 hours before your flight. You can also fill it out at the airport while waiting in line.
- **Immigration:** There are many kiosks for e-visa verification. We almost missed our connecting flight to Delhi due to a system outage, but thankfully, the flight waited for us.
- **Food:** I respect all kinds of food. I tried some street food delicious and safe, though different from what I grew up with.
- **Costs:** Hotels, food, and transportation are generally affordable.
- **Safety:** India is generally safe. Bad people exist everywhere, so staying extra cautious is wise.
